R1 CALGARY RESIDENTS: **NEW** RESIDENT RECRUITMENT FOR THE PERSONAL LETTER EDITING SESSION

Dear Residents,

On behalf of the Student Advising and Wellness (SAW) Office, we are writing to you regarding a new CaRMS session geared towards helping our clerks receive feedback on their personal letter statements. We would like to ask for your time and expertise to help ensure they receive meaningful assessments of their personal letters before submitting their final applications to CaRMS.

Students have expressed a great interest in receiving feedback from current residents regarding their experience writing personal letters for CaRMS. To help them obtain the most relevant information, the SAW office is asking for your assistance in participating in a **“Personal Letter Editing Session”**.

This formal editing session will give our students the opportunity to receive immediate feedback from residents who have recently participated in the CaRMS process. We will supply our resident volunteers with a check list to help guide comments and assessments. Also, samples of strong personal letters will be provided as a reference.

The Personal Letter Editing Session is scheduled from 6:30-7:45pm on September 18th in Medical Skills, Health Sciences Center. Each resident will meet with up to four students for 15 minutes each. This is a time commitment of just over an hour.

Curriculum Representatives

This position provides an opportunity to voice your ideas and opinions in shaping both the content and structure of the academic curriculum to meet the learning needs of residents. Site Representatives

Site Reps serve as the primary Resident liaison for the teaching clinics. Site reps are the go-to person for Residents who have concerns about their site, and for staff/preceptors at the site who want to communicate with all family medicine Residents.

Site Reps communicate information to the Chief Residents and to the rest of the RLC at meetings. Site Reps also attend two Family Medicine Residency Program Committee (FMRPC) meetings on a rotating basis. These meetings occur on the 3rd Thursday of the month, monthly, 0800 – 0930. The FMRPC meetings are led by the Program Director and attended by Department of Family Medicine (DFM) faculty and staff members to discuss Program-related business and vote on issues. At FMRPC meetings, Site Reps may bring forward Resident concerns about rotations, teaching sites, or our program on behalf of the Residents within their respective sites / divisions. Be advised that the Chief Residents attend all RPC meetings as well, to represent all Residents as a group.




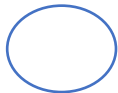

PHYSICIAN ADVISOR, SAFE MEDICAL CARE, CMPA

Dr. Piscione obtained his bachelor's and master's of science degrees at the University of Toronto's Faculty of Medicine and graduated in medicine at Queen's University. He completed residency training in pediatrics and clinical and research training in pediatric nephrology at SickKids Hospital in Toronto before obtaining his PhD in medical sciences at the University of Toronto's Faculty of Medicine. Dr. Piscione subsequently practised as a pediatric nephrologist and clinician-scientist at SickKids, and was an assistant professor in the Department of Pediatrics in the University of Toronto's Faculty of Medicine. While at SickKids, Dr. Piscione was associate director of the pediatric nephrology residency training program. He joined the CMPA as a physician advisor in 2014.
