Knowledge Resource Service (KRS) offers education sessions on a variety of topics, including KRS orientation, literature searching, point of care and e-resources, and citation management tools.

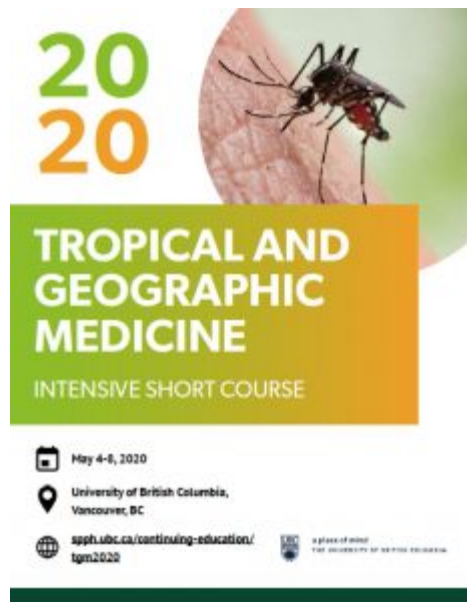

The annual Tropical and Geographic Medicine course aims to provide health practitioners an important update and overview of key tropical diseases with a focus on providing care in resource-limited settings as well as in Canada. This course is the first of its kind in western Canada. Over 300 physicians, nurses, pharmacists and other health professionals have successfully completed this course.

Topic: Grief and Colleague Support- January 9, 2019

The Department of Family Medicine was greatly saddened to learn of Dr. Michelle Hucul's death on December 21, 2019 following her battle with cancer. Dr. Hucul touched the lives of many residents and colleagues during her time in the Program.

The passing of a colleague can easily disrupt our established structure for coping with loss. We spend a tremendous amount of time with our colleagues. We work together, laugh together, and complain to one another, experience success and failures together, and have good and bad days together. Colleagues with whom we train and practice with can become akin to, or even closer than, family. A colleague's death may also bring up unexpected feelings related to the emotional challenges we face on a daily basis related to our jobs as physicians.

*The Program wants to ensure that space and time are provided for anyone having difficulty and/or desiring a safe place to discuss Michelle's death and its impact. The South Division's R1 academics will be cancelled on the morning of **January 9, 2019**. Dr. Jaelene Mannerfeldt and counsellors from the Office of Resident Affairs and Physician Wellness will provide a grief support and debriefing session from **0830-1030** in the **SHC Outpatient Tower (Meeting Room 410030)**. Both R1s and R2s are invited to this session. If you plan to attend the, please contact your Division Coordinator and Director so they are aware. R2s attending the session will be excused from clinical duties in the morning.*

Everyone's needs are different at this time. For R1s who do not wish to attend the session, academics will still run in NW and NE divisions. South R1s wishing to attend academics, please email Tannis to coordinate further.

We will continue to take care of each other at this time, and ensure that everyone feels safe expressing their feelings.
