R1 CALGARY RESIDENTS: **NEW INVITATION FOR 2020-2021 PBSG FACILITATORS**

Currently, the R1 PBSG sessions occurring monthly during the Program-Wide Academics are precepted by community-based and academic family physicians with training in PBSG facilitation. For the R2 year, this model shifts to one that has each group session led by 1-2 resident facilitators who have been trained. This change in the group structure more closely resembles the learning environment that practicing family physicians are in once in the community.

We need 12-14 current R1s who would be willing to attend a 3 hour resident facilitator training session some time during March-June.

Historically, these group sessions have been held with several other current R1s also interested in becoming Peer PBSG facilitators and have traditionally been held on a Wednesday evening so as not to conflict with any clinical rotations.

Feedback from previous R2 facilitators indicates the training and the experience as an R2 Peer Facilitator for PBSG is a highly valuable learning experience, and sets individuals up well for continuing to teach all levels of learners when out in practice.

Knowledge Resource Service (KRS) offers education sessions on a variety of topics, including KRS orientation, literature searching, point of care and e-resources, and citation management tools.

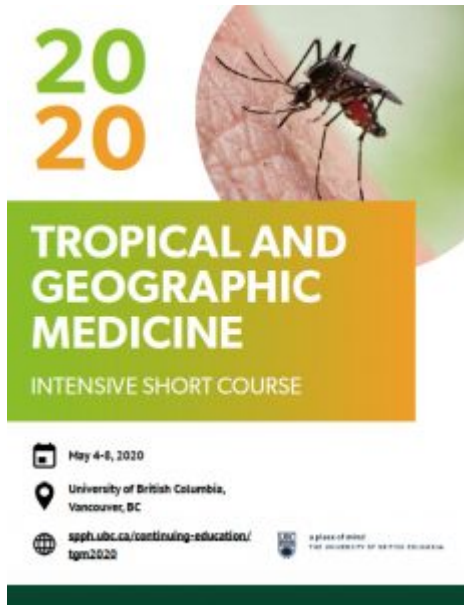
